HOW WILL THE BUDDIES PROJECT BUILD EVALUATION CAPACITY?

Evaluation capacity building is the process of developing and strengthening confidence, skills, abilities, and processes to undertake evaluation activities.

Partnerships For Health provides technical assistance and trainings on evaluation topics through BUDDIES Sessions.

BUDDIES Sessions are 1.5-hour training sessions that typically occur every other month.







Generate ideas and actionable strategies to move top 10 activities forward








PARTICIPATORY EVALUATION












COLLABORATIVE EVALUATION
